It is estimated that by 2050 two thirds of the world's population will be living in metropolitan areas. 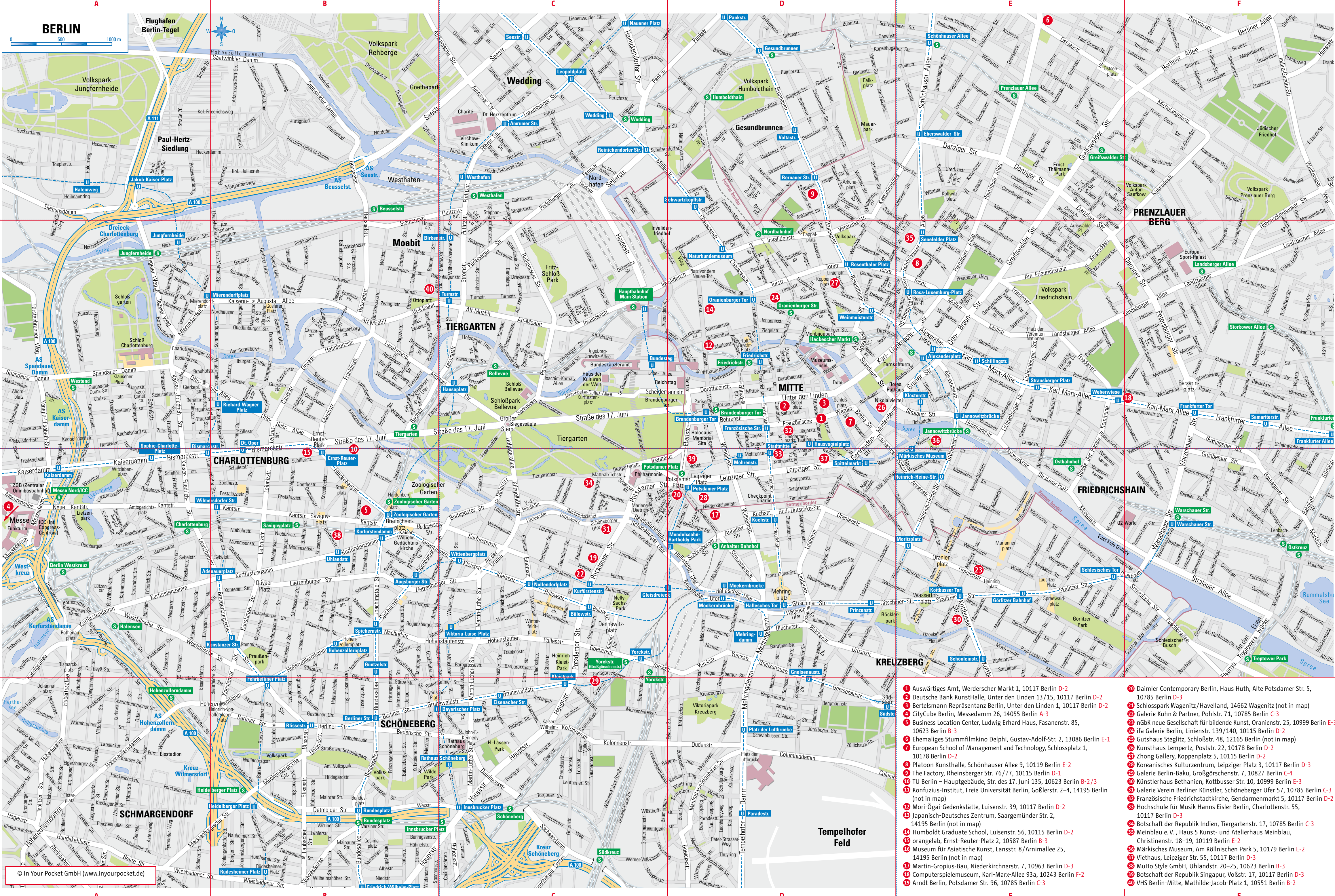

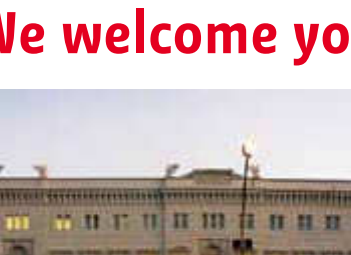

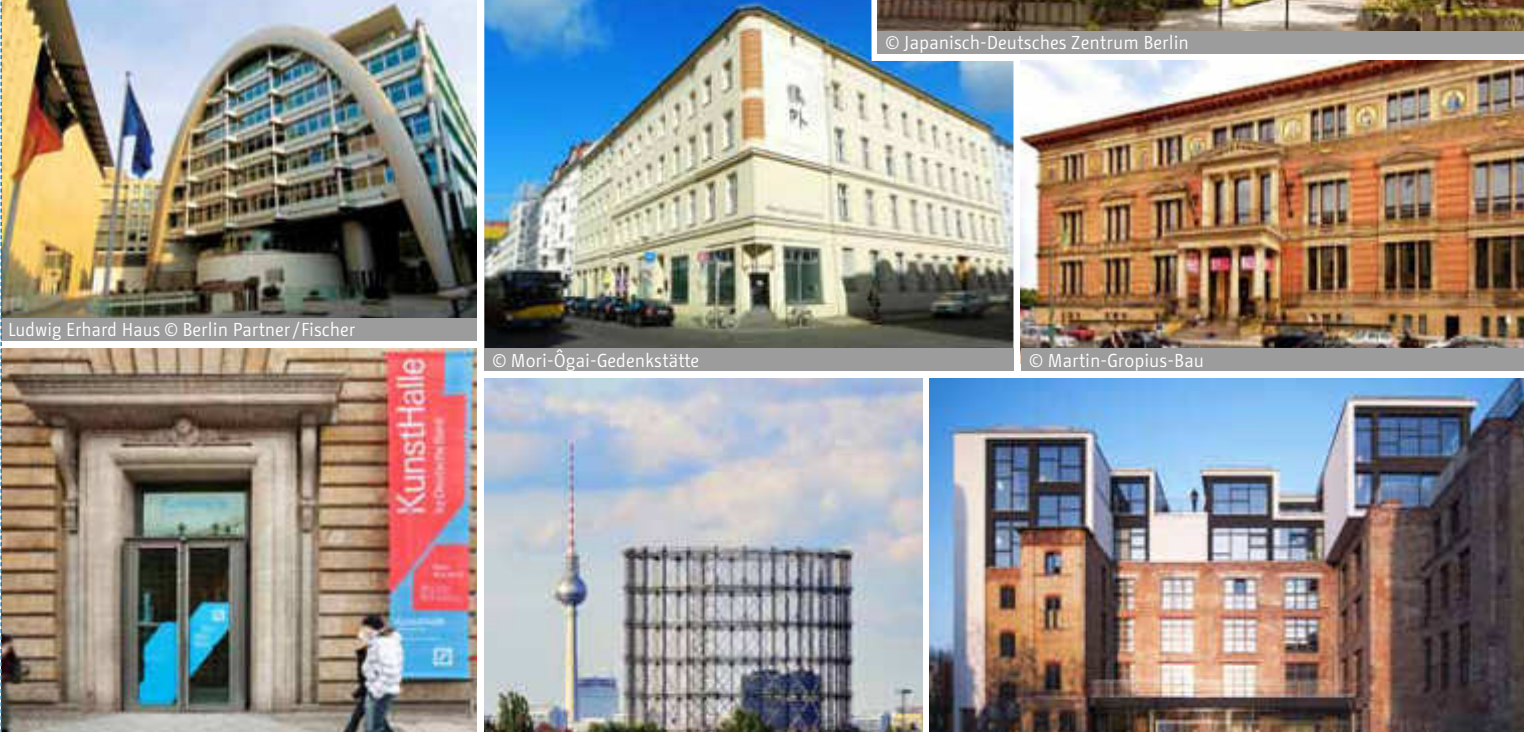
